



Oregon Farm Dog of the Year Competition Rules

Sponsored by the Oregon Agricultural Education Foundation

Eligibility

Oregon Farm Bureau members (and associate members) who are 18 years of age or older are eligible. Only one entry per person is allowed. All entries must be completed by April 1st, at midnight, PST.

Applicants agree to publication of their dog's image and application content by the Oregon Agricultural Education Foundation (OAEF).

Application

The six questions of the application are listed below. There is a maximum of 150 words for each question. One image of your farm dog is required.

1. How does your dog enrich your life and that of your family?
2. What activities on the farm or ranch does your dog perform or is your dog involved in?
3. What non-farm work activities do you and your dog do together for recreation?
4. What have you learned from your dog about work and life?
5. Describe your commitment to responsible dog ownership (safety practices, current vaccinations, proper nutrition, and care, etc.).
6. List any awards your dog has received, and any special skills your dog has, or tricks he/she can perform.

Judging

OAEF's panel of judges will review all applications. Judges are excluded from participating in the competition. The winning dog will be selected based on the information and detail provided in the question responses. The quality and composition of the image will also be judged.

Winner

The selected Oregon Farm Dog of the Year will receive a professional video (up to \$1,000) that can be used to compete in the American Farm Bureau Federation's American Farm Dog of the Year contest.

Participants also agree (1) to be bound by these Official Rules; and (2) that the decisions of the Judges are final and not appealable.



Applicants who are not selected as Oregon's Farm Dog of the Year are still eligible to enter the American Farm Bureau Federation's Farm Dog of the Year. Details are available at <https://www.fb.org/land/fdoty>
